Oshi Castle is located in the heart of the city and was built before 1479 in Bunmei period. It's known as the "floating castle" that held out against a flood attack organized by Ishida Mitsunari during Toyotomi Hideyoshi's suppression of Kanto region. Oshi Castle, which is one of the 7 castles of the Kanto region, became a symbol of the castle town of the hundred thousand koku Oshi domain.

The current three-story-tower of the Oshi Castle was rebuilt in 1988 after being torn down in the Meiji Period. The interior has become part of an exhibition room in the Museum. The top floor of the tower offers a view over the city.



Sakitama Ancient Tombs

The Sakitama Ancient Tombs are the largest group of ancient tombs in eastern Japan. 9 large tombs are located here, such as the Maruhakayama Kofun (the largest circulars burial mound in Japan) and the Inariyama Kofun where the "Kinsakumei Tekken" (Gold-inlaid-iron-sword), a national treasure, was excavated. The Sakitama Kofun Park has been set up around the ancient tombs with popular museums inside the park such as the Saitama Prefectural Museum of the Sakitama Ancient Burial Mounds and the Haniwa Museum where you can experience haniwa making firsthand.

Enjoy the mysterious beauty of the Gyoda Lotuses that have awoken from a long slumber at the Ancient Lotus Park here in Gyoda. In the Ancient Lotus Park you can see some 120,000 lotus blossoms of 42 types between late June to early August. The Gyoda lotuses are a primitive type with few petals and said to be lotus from approximately 1,400 to 3,000 years ago.

Gyoda prides itself on its traditional okonomiyaki style "furai" and potato and okara croquette style "zeri furai".

Furai But it's not tried in oil...

Gyoda's specialty food is a fried dish called "furai" that is prepared by dissolving wheat flour in water, lightly grilling it on a metal plate, adding ingredients such as green onion, meat, and eggs, and then putting on a Japanese-style worcestershire sauce or soy sauce to taste.

Northern Saitama where Gyoda City is located has long been a site of wheat production and this fried delicacy was originally something like a snack that could be easily made by farmers. At the tabi factories in Gyoda in its Showa period heyday, this dish was a big hit with the female workers and shops selling them established themselves all around. Currently there are more than 30 shops in the city that sell this fried delicacy.

It's not sweet! Zeri furai

Although the name is similar to "furai", the "zeri furai" is a completely different food. The zeri furai resembles an unclothed croquette and its roots are said to be in steam buns brought over from China during the Russo-Japanese War. The zeri furai consists of potato with green onions, carrots, and lots of okara so it's healthy and rich in dietary fiber. The flavor of the sauce and the fragrance are particularly appealing and the springy texture is a favorite of both children and adults.

Meet Kozeni-chan and Furabe.



Kozeni-chan is based on Gyoda's zeri furai and Furabe is based on Gyoda's furai. Plans are in the works to make these two into a countrywide brand for the furai and the zeri furai!



Aojima dye and cotton, the raw material for tabi, are produced in the area around Gyoda and in the late Edo period Gyoda became known as a site famous for the production of tabi

Sewing machines began to be used in the Meiji period and there was a drastic increase in the production volume of tabi. Banks were also established, capital became stable, sewing machines became motorized, and Gyoda's tabi became the best in Japan both in name and in substance.

In 1938 there were 84 million tabi socks produced here and this accounted for roughly 80% of the national production volume. "Gyoda's tabi production instruments and products" were registered in the National Register of Tangible Folk Culture in March of 2015.
